

Partial Hands Course for the Anaplastologist Thursday, January 31 – Saturday, February 2, 2019 South Florida, USA – Venue TBD

The IAA will be organizing a Somato Overview for the Anaplastologist in early 2019. The course is designed for Anaplastologists who would like to acquire a base understanding of our approach to production and fitting of partial hand prostheses.

Course Content

During the course, a variety of topics will be covered including consult, impressions, casting/reductions, prototype/color match, definitive production, extrinsic coloring/delivery, patient education, follow-up and specialized functional devices. Instructors will be onsite to lecture and provide hands-on instruction on impression taking, casting, vacuum forming and direct sculpting. Attendees will be provided with a course manual outlining what was covered.

Lecturers

David Robinson, BA, CCA, CFo Clinical Anaplastologist

David graduated in 2002 from the University of South Florida with a Bachelor's degree in Art Studio. Married to a congenital amputee, David understands first-hand how prosthetic devices can impact the lives of individuals.

David specializes in prostheses for the extremities, including fingers, hands, arms, toes and feet. Recognizing the need for increased durability and detail, he has spent years developing a fabrication process for custom silicone myoelectric arm coverings. David enjoys and encourages the spirit of collaboration with allied health professionals, such as physical/occupational therapists, prosthetists and orthotists.

David is a Past Treasurer of the International Anaplastology Association. He enjoys drawing and painting, playing guitar and spending time with his wife and two children.

Andrew Etheridge, MFA, CCA, CFo Clinical Anaplastologist

Andrew has been with the Anaplastology Clinic since 2012. He earned his BA at UNC-Wilmington and is a graduate of UNC-Greensboro where he received his MFA in Studio Art. As an active member of the Durham Art Community, Andrew continues to create and exhibit his sculptural work.

Andrew's path met head on with the health field when his personal artwork took a medical route inspired by personal experiences with the health community. Raised by a mother who spent her life as a nurse who now specializes as the Infection Control Co-ordinator at a hospital, Andrew knows the importance of first-rate healthcare and delivers compassionate care to all of his patients.
